Priority #1: Basic Services

Priority #2: Implementation of Common Core State Standards

- b. Did the district meet the requirements for stakeholder engagement as described in Ed Code sections 52062 (parent advisory committee input) and 52063 (EL parent advisory committee input if the district's enrollment includes at least 15% ELs and the district enrolls at least 50 ELs).
- c. Promotion of parental participation (How does the district generally seek parent input from all parents and from specific groups such as parents of ELs?)

Priority #4: Pupil Outcomes

Summarize each of the following data sources:

- a. Most recent CST and CAPA data, or data over most recent 2-3 years. Percent proficient in ELA, math and all other content areas, as appropriate to the district's grade spans and significant subgroups.
- b. API scores for 2012-13 and patterns of increase or decrease over the last 2-5 years for all students and each significant subgroup.
- c. The percentage of pupils that satisfy A-G requirements and career tech courses (if applicable).

- e. EL reclassification rate (most recent or trends for the last 2-3 years).
- f. Percentage of pupils who passed AP tests with a score of 3 or higher (if applicable).
- g. Percentage of pupils determined prepared for college by the EAP (if applicable). What percentage of pupils took the test, and of those, what percentage was determined prepared?.

Priority #5: Pupil Engagement

Summarize each of the following data sources:

- a. School attendance rates, truancy rates (most recent or for last school year)
- b. Middle school and high school dropout rates (if applicable)
- c. High school graduation rate (if applicable)

Priority #6: School Climate

Summarize each of the following data sources:

- a. Pupil suspension
- b. Pupil expulsion rates
- c. Other local measures: qualitatively or quantitatively describe any other local measures such as the Healthy Kids Survey results, or other surveys of pupils, parents or teachers on their sense of safety and school connectedness.

Priority #7: Course Access

Quantitatively and/or qualitatively define a metric to describe the degree to which all students have access to and are enrolled in all district-required areas of study:

- a. Students who are enrolled in elective classes offered by the district.
- b. Students enrolled in ELD and language arts or an intensive intervention class (ELA or math) **in lieu of** other courses generally taken by students who are not EL or in an intensive intervention class.
