It was very kind of the board president to let tonight's speakers speak during public comment for two and a half hours, but we need to think about how we use our time.

Ms. Little reported that the objective tonight was to approve a parent notification policy. It gave people a purpose and she is glad that we allowed them to speak. Ms. Little supports the parents right to know if a student has identified as transgender.

Mr. Giordano said he kept track of the speakers and there were 15 parents that spoke and 16 students. There is concern in the community on both sides of this issue and it is not up to the Board to make a decision on this as the law states that parents can't be contacted.

Ms. Cisneros reported that she is not going to stop advocating for parent's rights and she wants the Board to adopt a board policy for parental notification. Ms. Cisneros made to motion to have the Board adopt a board policy for parental notification on the September meeting agenda and Ms. Little gave a second. Mr. Herndon said that board members can talk about an item and then it goes back to the board president for consideration for the next agenda and if they deny it then it comes to the Board for a decision.

A. 2023 Needs Assessment Results

Michelle explained that, as in the past few years, this year's needs assessment was conducted through the LCAP Survey that was completed in January and February of 2023. In order to gain more insight into educational partners' feelings about the EL program, this year's EL portion was expanded from one question to three. She then shared the respondents' feedback.

B. 2023-24 Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP)

Michelle shared that the draft of the 2023-24 LCAP was presented to our advisory committees and educational parents on April 18, 2023, a meeting which the members of the ELACs and DELAC were invited to attend. She then went on to briefly highlight the action items that have the most direct impact on our EL students. Mr. Cachu expressed concern that Project-Based Learning training, which will begin with Court School staff in 2023-24, would be forgotten about with regard to Community School. Michelle assured him that Community School will receive PBL training in 2024-25.

C. California EL Roadmap Policy

Michelle directed attendees to the EL Roadmap Policy documents in the GAFE Drive and then addressed how the EL training that began with site administrators in 2022-23 and will roll out to teachers in 2023-24 will help Alternative Education to implement various elements of the four Roadmap principles.

D. Reclassification Procedures

Michelle reviewed the Reclassification Recommendation Form and the current criteria that are required for an Alternative Education student to be reclassified. She also shared information with the committee around the Observation Protocol for Teachers of English Learners (OPTEL) that the state is working to complete and which will be used to provide a standardized measure for use by teachers in evaluating a student's language proficiency.
