AB 1314 GENDER
IDENTITY PARENT
NOTIFICATION

Ms. Melissa Allen reported at the May board meeting this proposed legislation that was intended to require school districts to provide written notice to parents within three days of a student identifying as transgender did not move forward in the legislature. Ms. Allen reported there has been no change in the status of the bill and it cannot be reintroduced at this time.

Ms. Cisneros stated that she understood the bill is dead, but felt it is important for the Board to support parent rights. Ms. Cisneros cited a resolution and policy adopted by Chino Valley Unified School District in support of AB 1314 and requested that the Kern County Board of Education do the same. Mr. Marciano suggested sending a letter from the Board written with the guidance of counsel to members of the California Assembly members. Ms. Bray suggested that parent groups should write letters to Assembly members rather than a Board letter.

Ms. Allen said that even if the Board has a policy, the Board must follow the law as the law takes precedence over a board policy. Mr. Gonzalez suggested including this item on the agenda for the July board meeting as an action item and both Ms. Cisneros and Mr. Marciano agreed.

Ms. Cisneros expressed appreciation for changes to the Board website (Board service dates and trustee area maps). Ms. Cisneros helped with the Alternative Education graduation and is very proud of the students. Ms. Cisneros stated that she wants to continue to support legislation that will keep parents informed.

Ms. Bray also participated in the Alternative Education graduation ceremony, and it is one of her favorite days of the year. Ms. Bray said it was wonderful to celebrate the KCSOS employees that retired tonight and the resolutions were wonderfully written. Agenda item 5.2.1 Summary

Valley Oaks Charter is in need of a new site location due to high-speed rail and extensive upgrades and ADA compliance needs. Because of these two issues, we are seeking a new location to house the VOCS program.

For the past several months, we have been searching for various locations and found two sites that will be excellent for VOCS. 901 and 1001 Tower Way are available and are at very reasonable rates. The location works well for the program due to easy access from the Westside Parkways Freeway.

VOCS has been keeping a healthy reserve for the last several years in anticipation of a location change and will be able to utilize these funds to backfill the cost of the property. No dollars from the General Fund will be utilized when the sale is completed.

1200 Truxtun was offered to the office at a under market rate due to our need to find additional space for Community Connections (CCCC). We have been searching for property for them for the last year. They utilize space at Larry Reider building that has taken up conference and professional learning space.

The purchase of this new site will allow for CCCC to remain at Larry Reider and expand their space needs as well as allow KCSOS to utilize 1200 Truxtun for Professional Learning meeting space as well as larger group meetings that normally is housed at the Marriott.

The funds used for this site will be used by dollars provided by the State for facility needs through CCCC and our office. This will have a net zero impact to the General Fund as well.

Hopefully, this summary provides some info to help with the resolution on the board agenda.

- A. WHEREAS, Church Plaza, LLC (“Church Plaza”) owns certain improved real property located at 1200 Truxtun Avenue Bakersfield, California, further identified as Kern County Assessor’s Parcel Number 006-211-08 (“Property 1”); and
- B. WHEREAS, Crox, LLC (“Crox”) owns certain improved real property located at 901 Tower Way Bakersfield, California, further identified as Kern County Assessor’s Parcel Number 331-023-19 (“Property 2”); and
- C. WHEREAS, James C. Eckmann, Trustee of the James C. Eckmann Family Trust (“Trust”) owns certain improved real property located at 1001 Tower Way Bakersfield, California, further identified as Kern County Assessor’s Parcel Number 331-023-18 (“Property 3”); and
- D. WHEREAS, The Kern County Board of Education (“Board”), on behalf of the Kern County Superintendent of Schools, (“Superintendent”) desires to acquire Property 1 described above and depicted in attached Exhibit A-1, together with all improvements, privileges, rights, easements and appurtenances belonging to such real property, in order to provide additional office space and expand professional development facilities; and
- E. WHEREAS, The Board, on behalf of the Superintendent, desires to acquire Property 2 and Property 3 described above and depicted in attached Exhibits A-2 and A-3, respectively, together with all improvements, privileges, rights, easements and appurtenances belonging to such real properties, for the relocation of Valley Oaks Charter School; and
- F. WHEREAS, Church Plaza, Crox and the Trust, as owners of Properties 1, 2 and 3, respectively, desire to sell their property to the Board; and
- G. WHEREAS, Pursuant to Education Code sections 1042(c) and 35160, et seq., the Board may acquire any or all interest in real property which is needed for school purposes.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE BOARD:

- 1. The above recitals are true.
- 2. This Board desires to purchase Property 1 and Church Plaza desires to sell Property 1 for the price of \$4,385,000.
- 3. This Board desires to purchase Property 2 and Crox desires to sell Property 2 for the price of \$3,860,000.

4. This Board desires to purchase Property 3 and the Trust desires to sell Property 3 for the price of \$5,280,000.
5. This Board hereby authorizes the Superintendent or their designee to purchase Properties 1, 2 and 3 for the total purchase price of \$13,525,000 on its behalf.
6. This Board hereby further authorizes the Superintendent or their designee to execute all documents, take all other required actions and pay all other charges necessary to complete the purchase of Properties 1, 2 and 3 on its behalf.

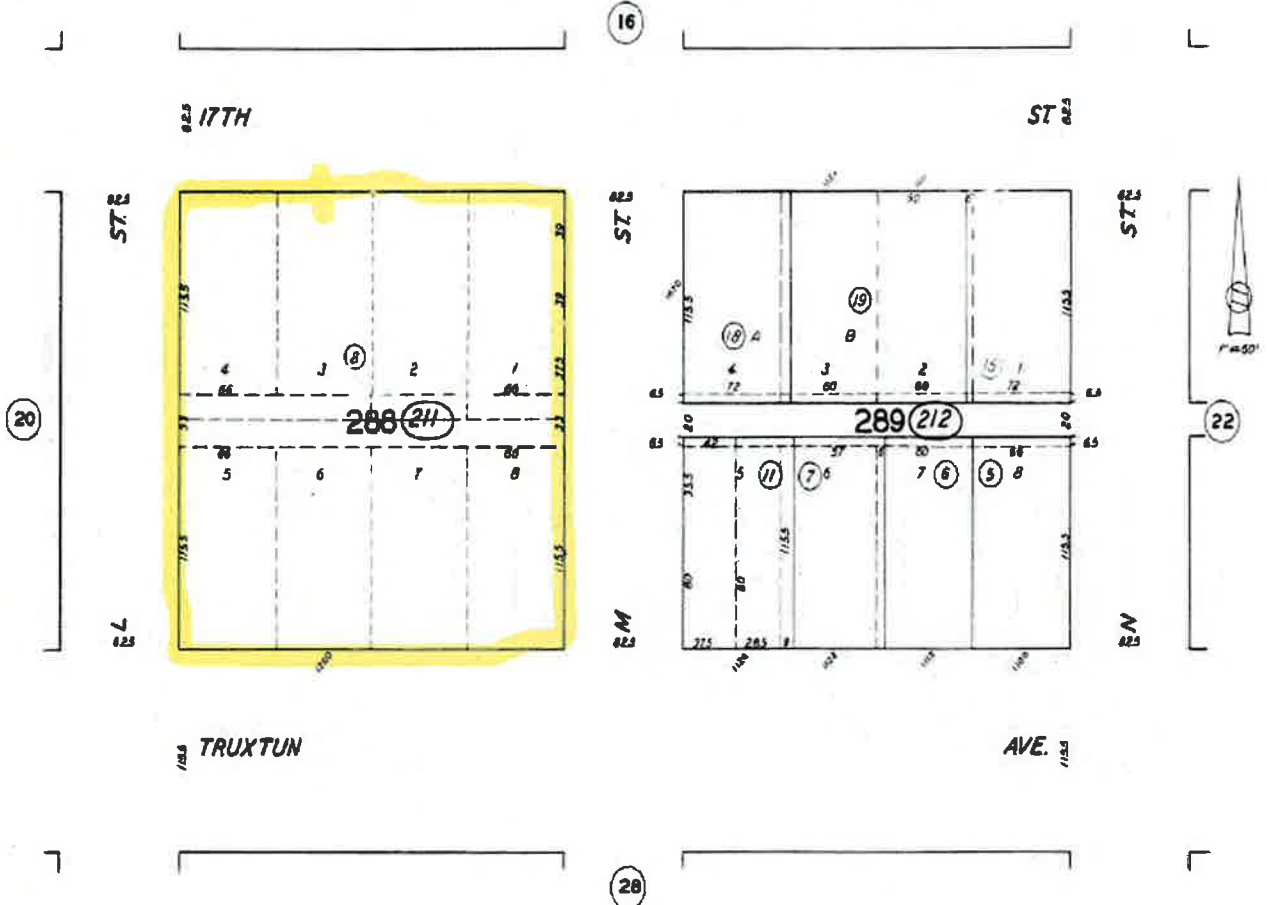

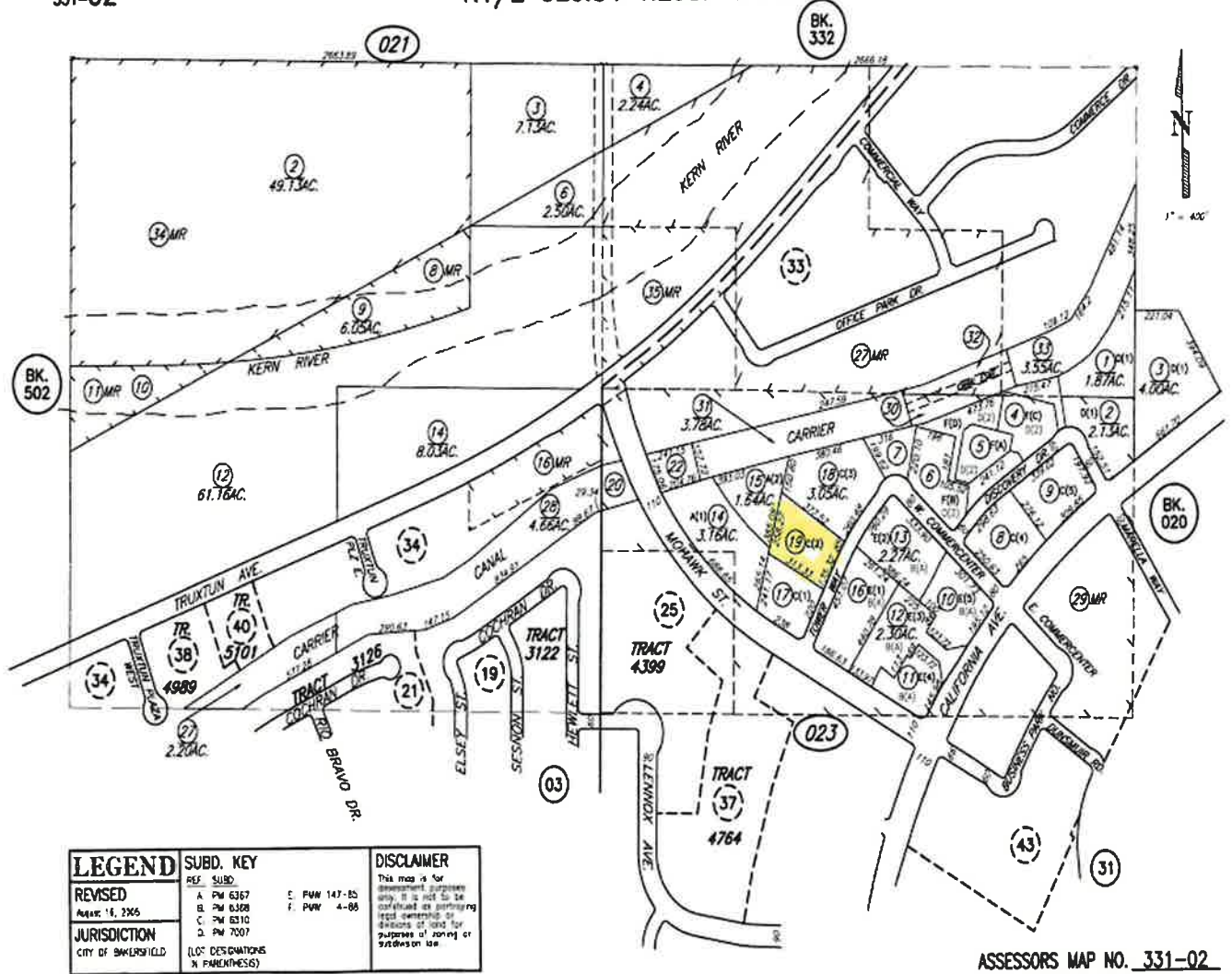
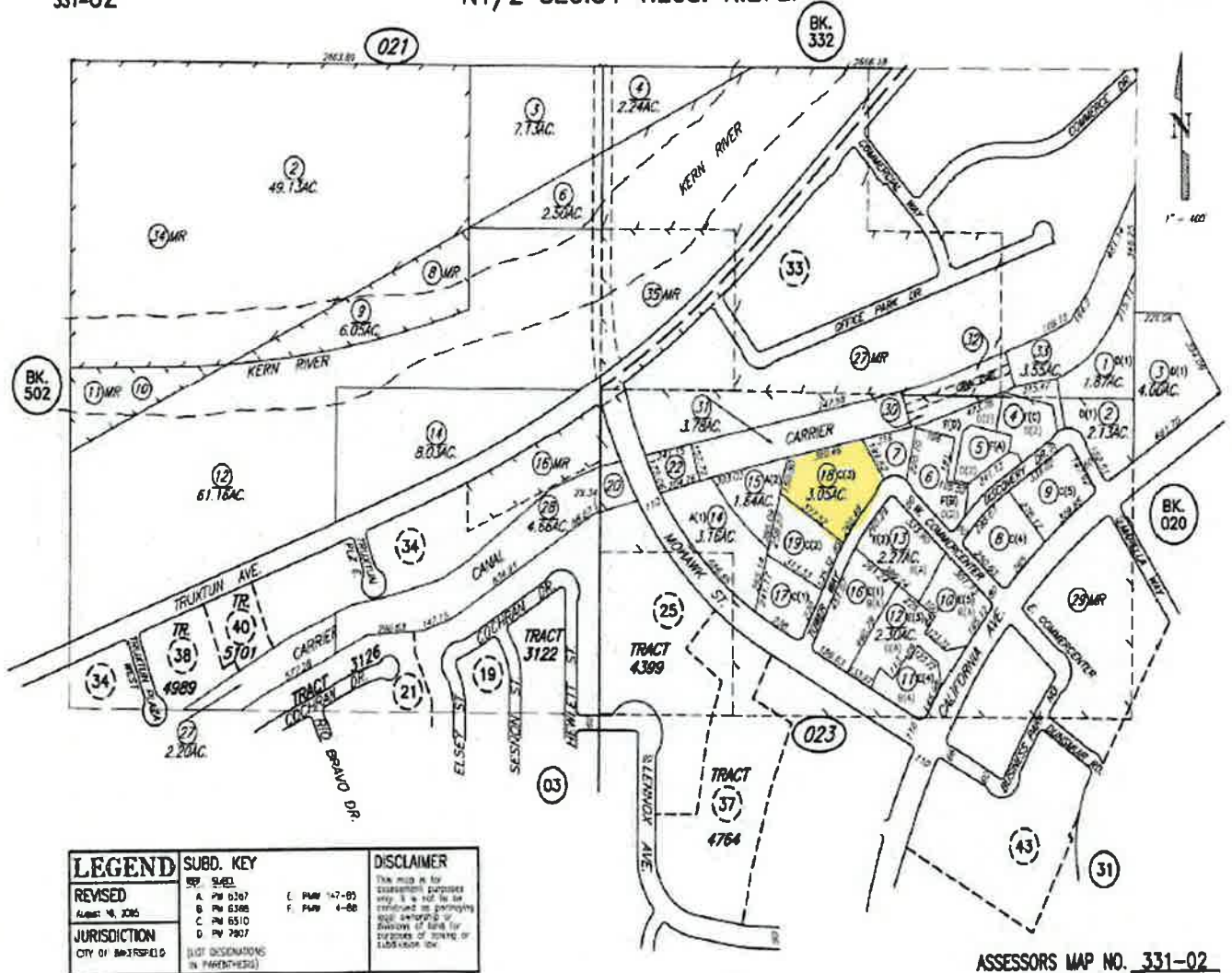

**RESOLUTION REGARDING PUPIL TEXTBOOKS
AND SUFFICIENCY OF INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS**

WHEREAS, the governing board of the Kern County Office of Education, in order to comply with the requirements of Education Code Section 60119 held a public hearing on July 11, 2023, at 6:30 p.m., which is on or before the eighth week of school and which did not take place during or immediately following school hours, and;

WHEREAS, the governing board provided at least 10 days notice of public hearing posted in at least three public places within the district that stated the time, place, and purpose of the hearing, and;

WHEREAS, the governing board encouraged participation by parents, teachers, members of the community, and bargaining unit leaders in the public hearing, and;

WHEREAS, information provided at the public hearing and to the governing board at the public meeting detailed the extent to which textbooks and instructional materials were provided to all students, including English learners, in the district/county office of education, and;

WHEREAS, the definition of “sufficient textbooks or instructional materials” means that each pupil has a textbook or instructional materials, or both, to use in class and to take home, and;

WHEREAS, sufficient textbooks and instructional materials were provided to each student, including English learners, that are aligned to the academic content standards and consistent with the cycles and content of the curriculum frameworks in the subject areas of mathematics, science, history-social science, and English-language arts, including the English language development component of an adopted program, and;

WHEREAS, sufficient textbooks or instructional materials were provided to each pupil enrolled in foreign language or health classes, and;

WHEREAS, laboratory science equipment was available for science laboratory classes offered in grades 9-12, inclusive, and;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that Kern County Board of Education hereby determines that for the 2023-24 school year, that each pupil in each school operated by the Kern County Superintendent of Schools Office has been provided with sufficient textbooks and instructional materials aligned to the academic content standards and consistent with the cycles and content of the curriculum frameworks.
