

Michelle reminded members that the purpose of the rules is to ensure an orderly meeting in which all participants can have their voices heard.

C. 2023-24 EL Program Evaluation

Michelle reviewed each of the measures that are used to evaluate the EL program annually and what our next steps are. She then asked attendees if anyone had other things to recommend based on the data that had been shared. Monica said that we need to identify additional EL training for 2025-26 and Nicole suggested having an ice cream social for students who demonstrate growth on assessments.

D. Parent Engagement Funds

(This item was inadvertently overlooked and the error was not realized until well after the meeting had ended. The discussion has been added to the agenda for the spring 2025 meeting.)

E. Reclassification Procedures

Michelle shared that she met a few weeks ago with one of the multilingual coordinators from KCSOS to review Alt Ed's reclassification procedures to discuss some of the details that are tricky in a setting like ours. She then reviewed Criteria 1, 2, and 3. No change is needed with them. Regarding Criterion 4, Michelle said that for the past several years, one of our options for comparing a student's "basic skills relative to English proficient students" has been for the student to have a grade equivalence of 5.5 or higher on the Star Reading assessment. This was based on the research from the Consortium for Reading Excellence (CORE) that was used several years ago to establish the reading level at which students needed to be placed in reading intervention and was applied to students in Grades 9-12. The guidance from the state, however, says that students being considered for reclassification must be compared to students of the same age, so Michelle analyzed Star data over the summer to determine the average Reading GE for students at each grade level and shared this with the committee. She then proposed that from now on, an eligible student would need to have a Star Reading GE equal to or higher than the average GE of students in their same grade level based on the most recent data available. Michelle is going to rerun the data each summer for use the following school year. Jamie moved that we adopt this new criteria and Nicole seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

F. Parent Involvement Policy

Committee members reviewed the Court School and Community School Parent Involvement Policies. There were no questions or comments.

G. School-Parent Compact

Committee members reviewed the Court School and Community School School-Parent Compacts. There were no questions or comments.

H. LEA Parent and Family Engagement Policy

Committee members reviewed the LEA Parent and Family Engagement Policy. There were no questions or comments.

I. Uniform Complaint Procedures (UCP) Policies and Procedures

Michelle noted that it was recently discovered that when this document was created last year it was not translated, but that it is now being translated and will be added to enrollment packets as soon as we get it back. Committee members then reviewed the UCP Policies and Procedures. There were no questions or comments.

RECITALS

A. The Kern County Board of Education ("Board") is the owner in fee simple of that certain real property located near the intersection of Cottonwood Road and Watts Drive in Bakersfield, CA (APNs 170-270-21 and 170-270-23) containing approximately 10.34 acres of undeveloped land as further depicted in Exhibit A (Parcel Map) to this Resolution ("Property").

B. The Board has determined that it would be in its best interest to sell the Property because it is not necessary for classroom buildings and the Board no longer has a use for the Property.

C. The Property does not possess any of the characteristics listed in Government Code 54221(f)(2) as it is not (A) within a coastal zone, (B) adjacent to a historical unit of the State Parks System, (C) Listed on or determined by the State Office of Historic Preservation to be eligible for, the National Register of Historic Places, (D) Within the Lake Tahoe region as defined in Section 66905.5.

D. Government Code sections 54220 et seq. (California's Surplus Land Act) requires that, prior disposition of surplus land, local agencies declare the land to be "surplus land" or "exempt surplus land" and follow the requirements of the Act;

E. Government Code section 54222 requires that, any local agency disposing of surplus land send a written notice of availability of the property to the agencies listed under the code; and

F. Education Code section 17464 et seq. requires that, prior to any sale to the public, the surplus land be offered to specified public agencies and other entities and, if applicable, to the previous owner where the property was acquired by eminent domain within the past 20 years.

RESOLVED

1. The above recitals are true and correct, and the Board so finds and determines.
2. The Board hereby takes formal action and finds and declares the Property is "surplus land" as used in the Act, because the Property is owned in fee simple by the Board and is not necessary for the Board's use.
3. The Board hereby authorizes and directs the Kern County Superintendent of Schools ("Superintendent") or his designee to send a Notice of Availability/Offer to Sell Surplus property to those state and local agencies as required by Government Code section 54220 et seq.
4. The Board hereby authorizes and directs the Superintendent or his designee to give written notice of availability for developing low- and moderate-income housing to any local public entity, as required to comply with requirements under Government Code 54222. Priority consideration shall be given to agencies interested in the property under Government Code section 54222.
5. The Board hereby authorizes and directs the Superintendent or his designee to give public notice of the Availability/Offer to Sell to public entities and nonprofits by publishing the notice in a regularly published newspaper in the County once a week for three successive weeks, with at least five days intervening between the respective publication dates, not counting the publication dates, as required by Education Code section 17464 et seq.
6. The Superintendent or his designee is further authorized to take any further actions necessary to comply with requirements of Government Code 54220 et seq. or Education Code section 17464 et seq.
7. In the event that none of the public agencies or other entities required to receive notice pursuant to Government Code 54220 et seq. or Education Code section 17464 et seq. offers to purchase the Property, or if the Board and a public agency or other entity required to receive notice do not reach an agreement on the terms and conditions of the purchase and sale, the Board authorizes the Superintendent, or his designee to offer the Property for sale to the general public pursuant to Education Code section 17466.

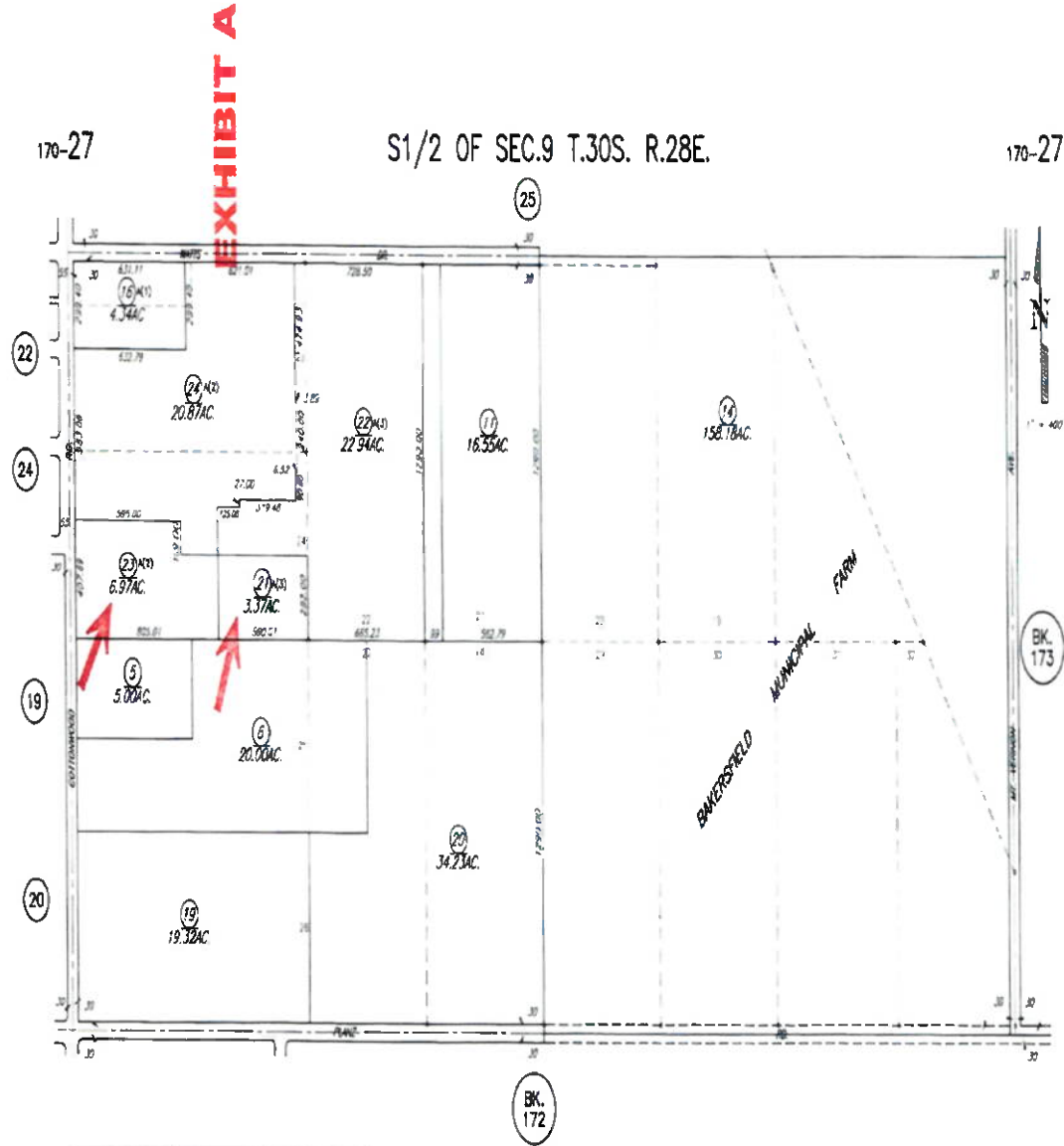

WHEREAS, the Auditor-Controller of the County of Kern has recently informed the County Superintendent of potential adverse consequences to local tax and general fund monies of the County School Fund attributable to pending court action; and

WHEREAS, several claims are now pending before the Assessment Appeals Board which, if determined favorably to the taxpayer will substantially impact revenues of the County Superintendent through a forced refund; and

WHEREAS, counsel has advised the Board that a school board may not defer repayment of a tax refund over an installment period of up to ten (10) years pursuant to Education Code section 35201 due to hardship or any other factor; and

WHEREAS, Education Code section 14240 authorizes this Board to direct the County Auditor to impound local tax revenues pending determination of court action or administrative tax protests is that such money remains outside the scope of further Board action pending resolution of the dispute.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board resolves as follows:

1. The Superintendent is authorized and directed to impound \$1,770,366.48 in light of the above tax protests and court litigation.
2. The Superintendent shall report that amount to the Board and notify the County-Auditor-Controller that the impound is to be made in April and May 2025.
3. The amount so impounded shall be derived entirely from anticipated local tax revenues. No part of the impounded funds shall come from the general reserve or current operating year monies of the County School Service Fund.
