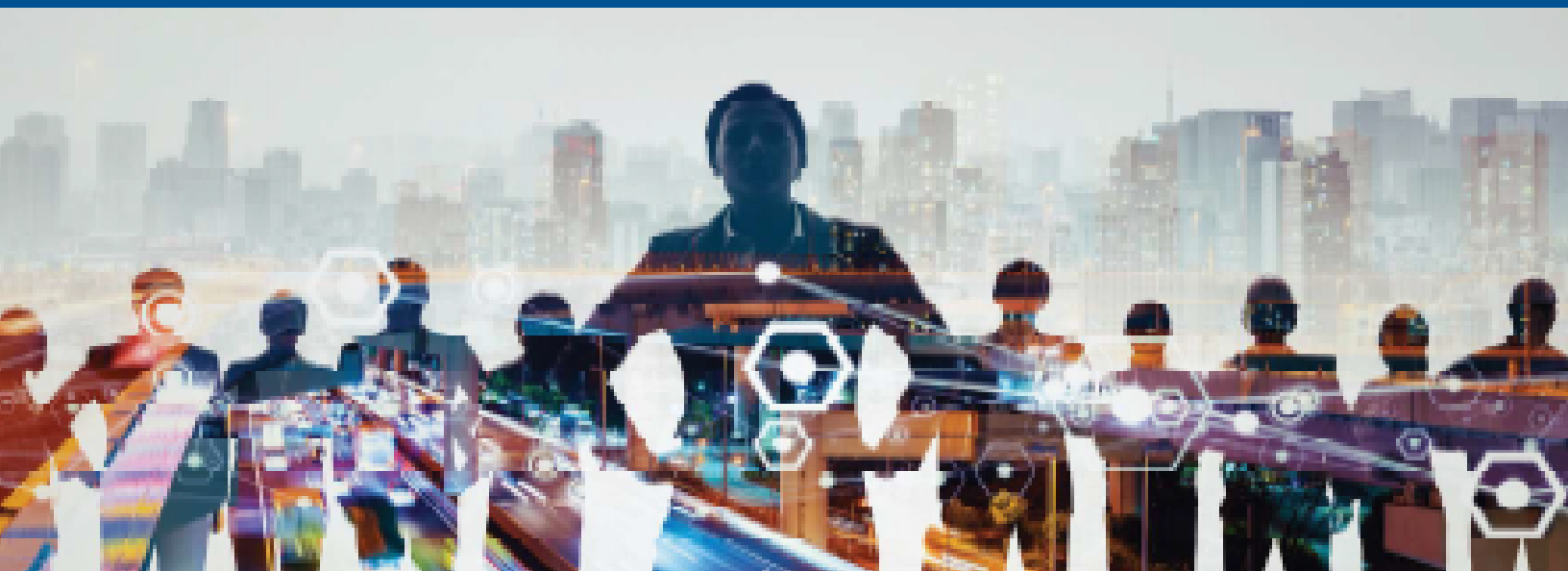


Basic Threat Evaluation and Reporting Course

The Basic Threat Evaluation and Reporting Course (B-TERC) is a one-day training that teaches people how to help stop violent acts, like terrorism or school shootings. It shows participants how to spot signs that someone might be planning violence and gives them tools to report these signs. It also teaches strategies to help steer people away from violence.

Participants will:

- Define targeted violence
- Outline the Pathway to Violence Model and the four-step Behavioral Threat Assessment and Management Model
- Understand how to identify threats or observable behaviors that may concern others while adhering to individual's constitutional rights, privacy, civil rights, and civil liberties
- Recognize the role of community in targeted violence prevention
