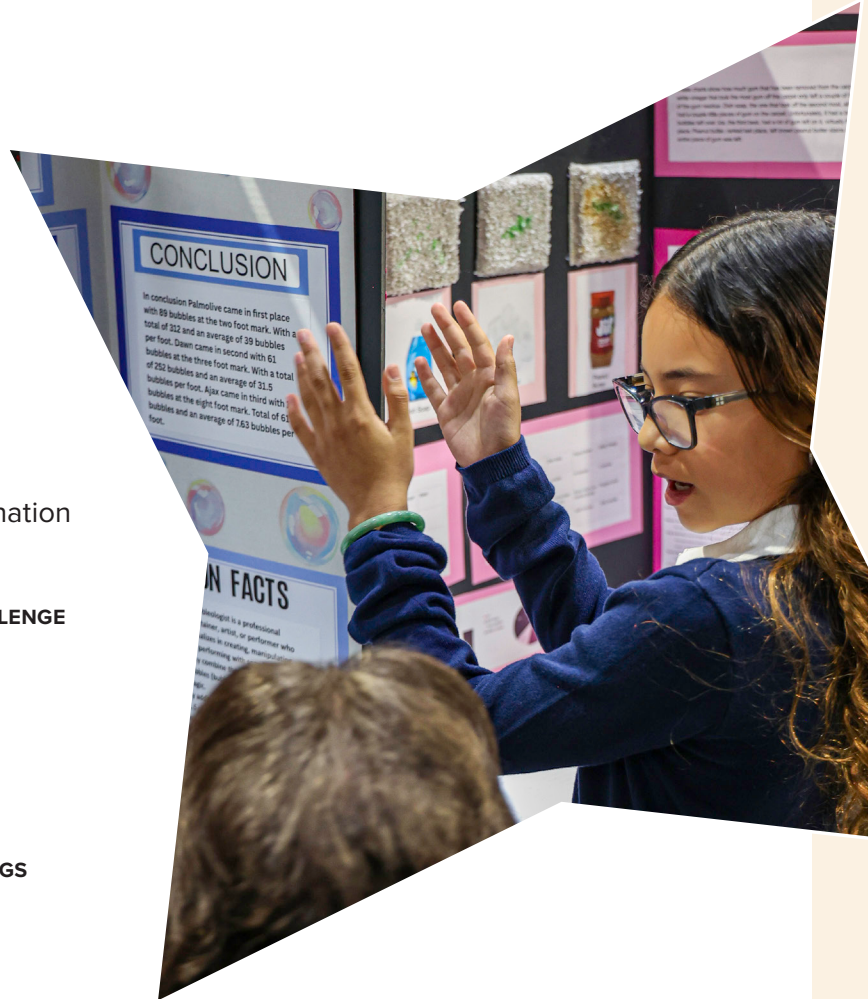

Event specific information is mailed to district superintendents and site principals. If your district/school decides to participate in student events, you may be asked to:

- Provide volunteers to help with various aspects of the event
- Furnish judges for the event
- Provide a liaison with an e-mail address, who will act as event point person and share all correspondence with students, parents and other teachers at your site/district
- Share the “Letter to Parents” and “Event Etiquette” that are on the following pages with your students and their parents.

Student Event Etiquette

- Students should have FUN when competing.
- Teachers, parents, and students should demonstrate good sportsmanship at all times. Teacher may not prompt or coach students when competing virtually.
- Things may not always go the way you and your child hope or expect, but make the best of the situation. Please remember that your student/child takes behavior cues from you.
- Talk to your child about disappointment and set an example of how to be gracious in disappointing situations.
- Judging is a subjective process and judges’ decisions are final.
- Judges volunteer their time to make student events possible. Please do not express concerns or complaints to the volunteer judges. If you have a complaint, please find or email the event coordinator to express your concerns.
- We are guests at our event venues. Please be courteous and respect the property of others.
- Do not enter or leave a room during a presentation. Virtual competitions will be participants only.
- Avoid unnecessary noise during a presentation.
- Turn off all cell phones when in a competition room.
- Ask permission of competitors before taking photos or videotaping them.
- Be gracious in disappointing situations, and learn to be gracious in winning.

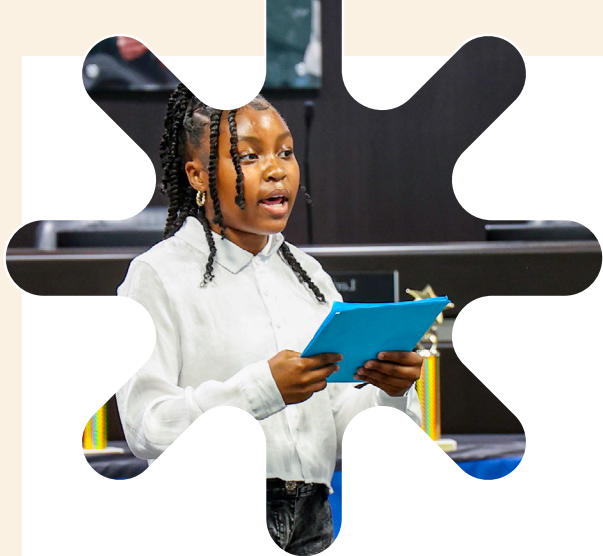

Grades 11-12

Teams of students from local high schools will demonstrate their understanding of the U.S. Constitution during the annual “We the People: The Citizen and the Constitution” Congressional Hearings competition. In this authentic simulation of a congressional hearing, students serve as constitutional experts, delivering prepared statements and responding to in-depth questions on key principles of American government.

Each school is divided into six teams, with each team focusing on a different area of study, including the foundations of the American political system, the creation of the Constitution, the expansion of constitutional ideals, the application of constitutional principles in practice, the rights protected by the Bill of Rights, and the challenges facing democracy in the 21st century. During the hearings, students present their analyses and engage in rigorous dialogue with a panel of judges that includes educators, attorneys, and civic leaders.

The competition challenges students to think critically, communicate effectively, and apply constitutional principles to both historical and contemporary issues—developing the knowledge and skills necessary for informed and active citizenship.

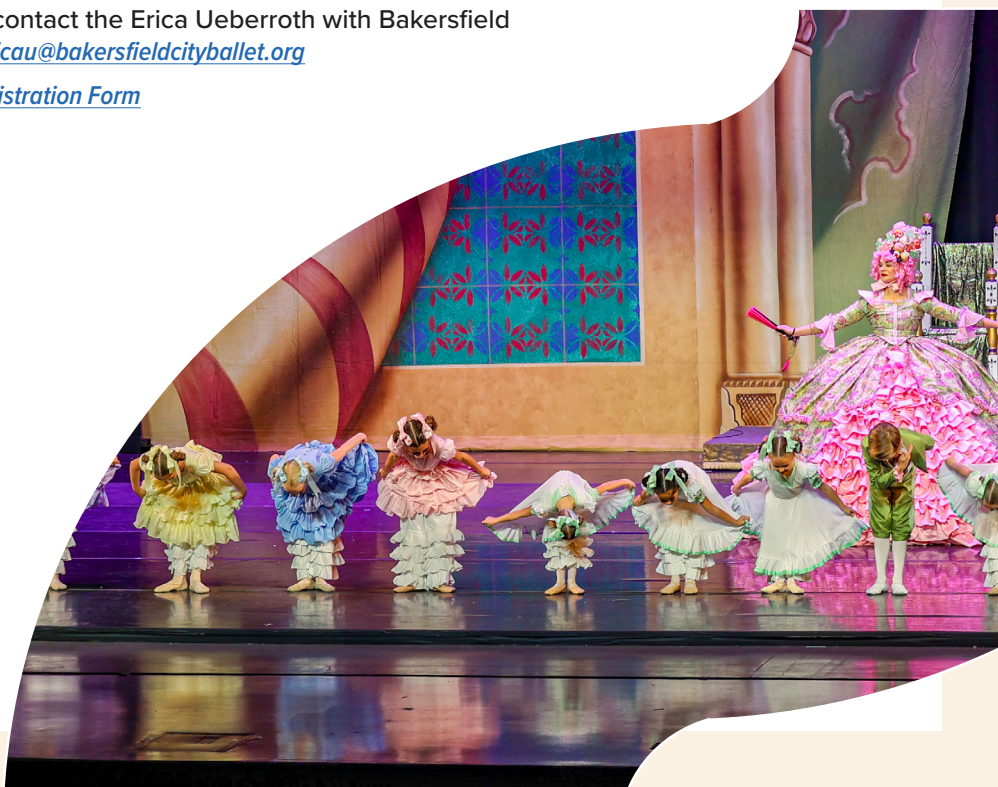
