School Profile

Veteran's Elementary School is a suburban school of 921 students in TK-6th grade. The school boasts a supportive staff which includes a counselor, dean, physical education teacher, learning center and RSP teachers. The school follows the tenets of "Leading Impact Teams" which creates a positive culture and conditions for every teacher every day.

School Demographics

The ethnicity of the student population includes: 53% White, 34% Hispanic or Latino, and 3% Filipino. The additional student groups from this population include: 27% Socioeconomically Disadvantaged, 21% English Learners, and 10.5% Students with Disabilities.

Self-Identified Contributing Factors

• Impact Teams was a 2- year training for Veterans staff under direction of author Barb Pitchford. Impact Teams create the culture and conditions for every teacher every day to answer the question: "What is my impact?" The Impact Teams model is a strengths-based approach to help teachers operationalize the highest influences on student learning by focusing on critical learning goals, analyzing evidence, and taking collective action through the following:



- Partner with students to strengthen student ownership of learning and develop assessment-capable learners.
- Engage students in self and peer assessment by embedding formative assessment into the classroom.
- Build a culture of efficacy based on strengths, trust, collaboration, and the use of practical, easy-to-implement protocols.
- Teacher clarity through unpacking standards as a collaborative practice, and building teacher efficacy.
- o <u>Growth Mindset</u> focused on progress over proficiency.
- o Success criteria through a rubric with self-evaluation by students.
- Create a culture of a teachable staff willing to change for the benefit of the students.

• Writing in every grade level:

- o Expectations are articulated across grade levels through teacher collaboration.
- o Thinking Maps are used in classrooms.
- Exemplars are given for scoring. Students compare and evaluate their writing with exemplar examples.

• Kindergarten Readiness:

- o High expectations for TK/Kindergarten classes.
- o Calendar time includes whole class instruction.
- Use of common language begins in kindergarten with proper language/terms used K-6th.
- o Phonemic Awareness includes Haggerty's pedagogy of phonemes and phonics.
- Kindergarten readiness class for parents one year prior to enrollment gives parents ideas on how to prepare their child for school.
- o Math-centers focus on learning with manipulatives.
- Accelerated Reader assessments are given K-6th.

• Intervention:

- Pull out programs are provided in grades 1st thru 6th with small group instruction with reading specialists. Programs include the following:
 - o Read Live and Read Naturally.
 - o Dibels and Teacher generated assessment for a running record.
 - SIPPS (<u>Systematic Instruction in Phonological Awareness, Phonics, and Sight Words</u>).
 - o Orton-Gillingham used for students with Dyslexic tendencies.



- Common themes and language utilized in grades K-6:
 - o Block schedule given for ELA and math
 - o Differentiation in the classroom
 - Uses California Expressions math textbook which is rigorous and maintains high expectations
 - o Common academic language
 - Classroom sign language
 - o Restate, Answer, Cite, Explain (RACE)
 - o Computer use beginning in kindergarten with 1:1 devices and daily practice
 - o Surface knowledge to deep learning from Blooms vocabulary
 - Whooo's Reading App in conjunction with Accelerated Reader as a prep prior to taking the AR test
 - Classroom libraries

• Positive School Culture:

- o Volunteers trained on specific jobs within the classrooms and around the school.
- o Administrators are visible at the gates and during recess.
- o PBIS is implemented in all classrooms.
- o Kindness week participation across the campus.
