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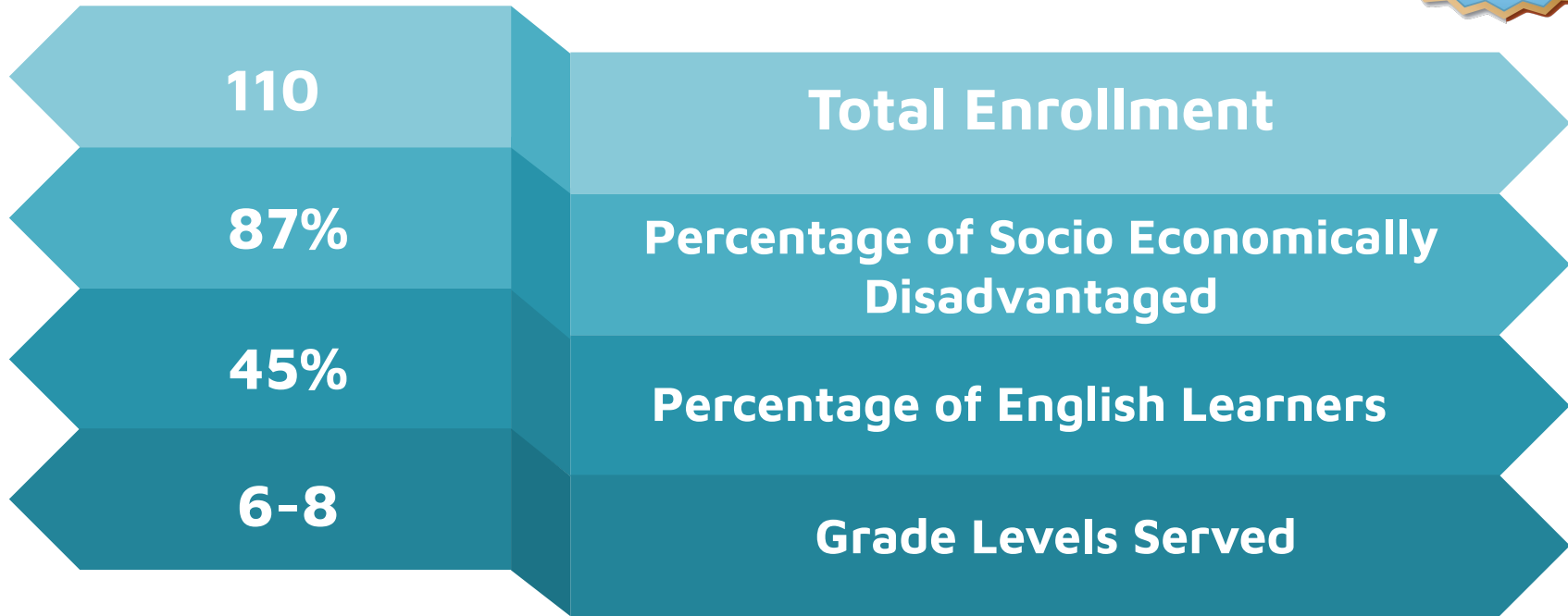

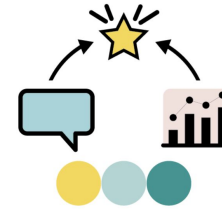
3. Strategy to Address



Getting organized

- Tier I (PBIS team) and Tier II (SSS/SEL) **team meetings** have helped organize the district to be more strategic
 - TFI, FIA, and CASEL annual assessments to measure system effectiveness and implementation
 - Annual retreat to build an action plan based on one or two TFI features
 - Meet every two weeks (Tier I) or month (Tier II) with clear agenda, objectives, and “next step” items
 - Use PBIS Rewards and SWIS data for measurement
- **Collaborate** with multiple organizations, including College Community Services and Kern Behavioral Health
- Receive **coaching support** for agendas, protocols, data use, and general system leadership via Koru Strategy Group
- Combine SELPA SEP plan with PBIS action plan for **coherence**

Fidelity Integrity Assessment - SWIFT



What is this resource?

The SWIFT-Fidelity Integrity Assessment (SWIFT-FIA) is a self-assessment tool schools and local educational agencies (LEAs) can utilize to monitor their progress in relationship to the SWIFT domains and features.

Why is it valuable?

The SWIFT-FIA guides school and LEA teams through conversations directly related to the SWIFT domains and features. School Teams score themselves on priorities for improvement and implementation status. The results can be used to adjust their short-term action plans.



- Operate a **community school** model since 2018
 - Governed by -- Children's Cabinet of West Kern
 - Structured by -- 5 key pipelines
 - Early childhood engagement
 - Expanded learning
 - Math education
 - Family and community engagement
 - Social and health services
 - Organized by -- MTSS/PBIS principles
 - Funded by -- federal Full-Service Community School and School Climate Transformation grants, pooled LCAP funding across multiple districts, state California Community School Program
 - Backbone improvement support by -- Figueroa Consulting Co.
 - Evaluated by -- WestEd
- One **community school coordinator** per school site
- One **social worker** and **AmeriCorps Mentor** per school site
- Partnership with **multiple school districts** (West Kern Consortium)



West Kern Consortium

In 2008 the West Kern Consortium (WKC) is a partnership between Lost Hills Union Elementary School District, Mendocino County School District and Santa Barbara County School District, joined by the State Department of Education. The goal of the consortium is to improve student performance, school performance, behavioral outcomes, and attendance rates through a variety of programs. The WKC provides the following services to provide support to students, parents, and the broader community.

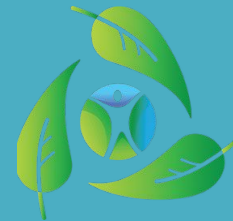

Prepare U for 8th Grade



- Partnership with **Kern County Behavioral Health and Recovery Services** to implement Prepare U curriculum for 8th grade students
- Pilot project to help students **think through their feelings** and **build important life skills** based on a number of topics
- Two teachers have been **trained and certified**



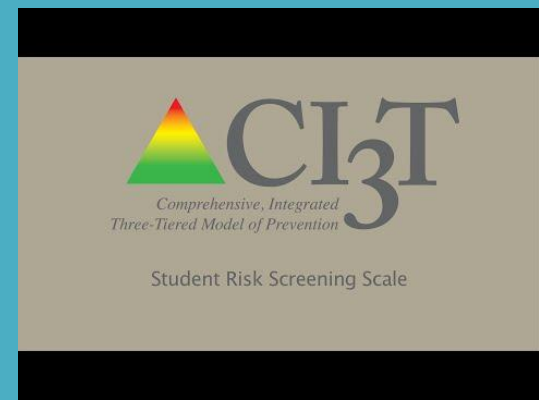

Student Risk Screening Tool (SRSS-IE)



- External AND **internal behaviors** rated by teachers at the beginning, middle, and end of year (follow same pattern as Acadience literacy assessment)
- Helped the counseling and social work staff **identify at least 20 more students for counseling services** that might not have otherwise been identified



▶ **Venus**

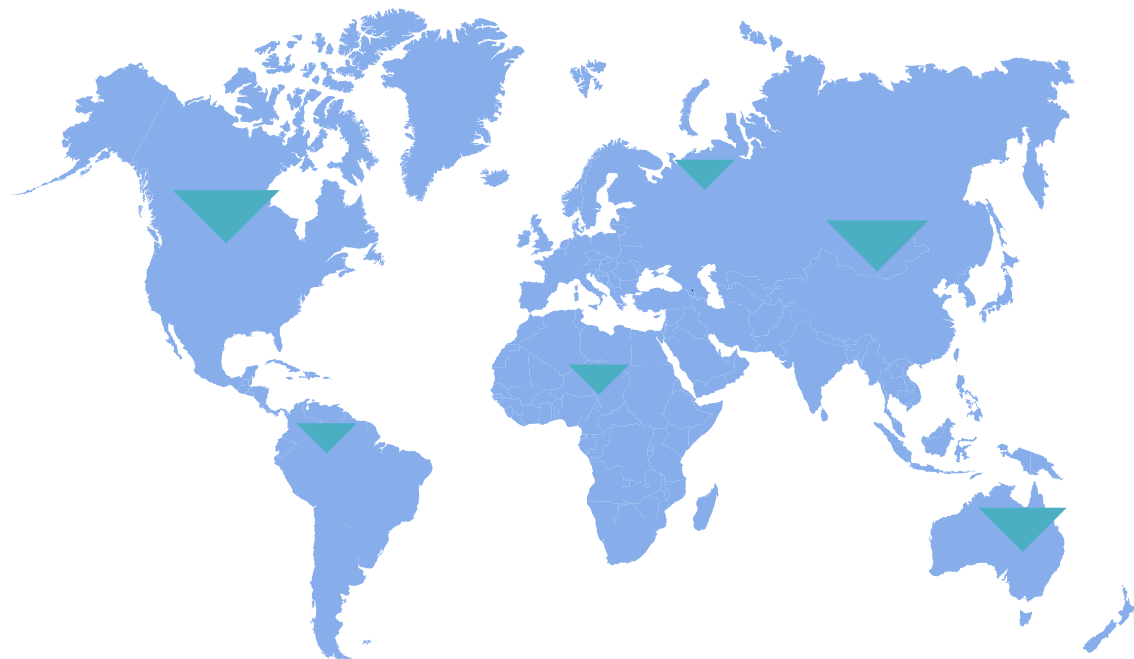
