School Profile

Website: Franklin Elementary is an urban school located in downtown Bakersfield with its entrance on a main commuter road and the backside in a residential community. The well-established school site celebrated its 100-year anniversary in 2014. In addition to classroom teachers, the school also hosts a librarian, Family and Community Engagement Liaison, Speech Therapist, Campus Supervisor, Behavior Intervention Specialist, Academic Coach, and Area Administrator from BCSD.

School Demographics

Franklin Elementary is a TK – 6th grade public school with an enrollment of 532 students, of which 78.3% are Socioeconomically Disadvantaged, 10% English Learner and .4% Foster Youth(Data Quest, 2019-2020). Service Delivery Model: Focus on Coherence.

The majority of the students are Hispanic or Latino, with a count of 341, 96 are White, 54 African American, and 26 stated two or more races (Data Quest, 2019-2020).

Contributing Factors

Delivery Model: Focus on Coherence.



- A cluster meeting is held at a school site with Principal and Area Administrator (AA)
 Subject is focused around a book talk, presentation, and discussion which is then taken to the school sites by to deepen coherence.
- Feeder school within BCSD, have the same oversight AA. This is the integral part of coherence of service delivery. Service delivery model includes meetings where all the cluster schools' educational staff, support staff, and SEL staff meet with AA.
- Connection to resources by AA with specialists within BCSD.
- Principal makes sure that implementation happens and integrity of the framework is taught, as identified in PLC and Learning Walks.
- Teacher and administration sustainability-little turnover of teachers and principal over the past 16 years.

Learning Walks:

- Principal and AA walk school regularly on Mondays with directors i.e. those in charge of Curriculum and Instruction and Special Education. Twice a month the AA walk with the directors to collaborate and observe classrooms. Walks with just the principal and AA. One hour is a learning walk where things are calibrated and seen by all grade levels and other school sites for feedback. Walk with service providers to see how students can be served. Walk through with the standards in hand for math or ELA. Walks with math coach to make sure that it is done with fidelity.
- Electronic Walk through form (1) on Google with who you visit.
- Show and demonstrate feedback and teachers know what you are specifically watching for within the walk.
- Principal will Cognitively Coach through different items that were observed during the Learning Walk.
- Principal uses own staff to learn from each other while building capacity of the teaching staff
- From the walks, the principal and coach are able to confirm and affirm strategies that are seen. They split the campus every day with the coach and the principal in the classroom about an hour everyday observing and meeting with the teacher.
- The Principal Schedules time in her weekly planner to visit classes between 9-10 am.

Effective Professional Learning Community (PLC) cycle (2)

- Curricular Planning Cycle, Unit guide that is generated by district, Unit guide for math has resources within BCSD. Collaboration "you do it together" and then you do it alone.
- Collaboration within PLC for Teachers to plan the questions for student to teacher discourse and student to student discourse.
- Assessments reviewed in PLC and changes made to help with differentiation for students.
- Comprehensive Continuum (3) for all grade levels and all students through articulation during PLC cycle. Consistency from grade level to grade level. Grade Level expectations



are set and understood through the PLC for teachers and students to follow from each grade level.

Assessment Cycle: Includes Running Records and Benchmark Assessment System that follows the Assessment Calendar (4).

- Assessment are given to help teachers understand the independent level of the student Practice "test taking" strategies all year.
- CFAs (5) reviewed at PLC meetings.
