
OVERVIEW

Find It. Be It. Kern County is a campaign that creates awareness of the county's career education programs to help increase the number of students who enroll in and complete career pathways that begin in high school and seamlessly transition to college.

Find It. Be It. Kern County, which targets students between the ages of 13 and 16 and their parents, was created through a partnership of the Kern County Superintendent of Schools, the Kern Community College District, and the Career Pathways Improvement Project. Through this effort, we are communicating that career education is an easy way to get a head start on gaining marketable skills in a fun, hands-on environment. Also, Kern County schools offer graduation-ready career skills and a rampway to multiple career pathways in college.





CONTACT CAREER EDUCATION TEACHERS



SEARCH FOR CAREER PROGRAMS BY HIGH SCHOOL





After you click on an industry cluster, you will land on a page that includes:

- A short description about the types of careers in that industry cluster.
- A list of Kern County high schools that offer career education programs within that cluster.

Students and parents can click on their high school of choice to get to the school's career education department.
