- Title II. These funds address teacher quality and are used for trainings and conferences.
- Title IV. There is a lot of flexibility with Title IV and these funds will be added to those we receive from Title I.

Sal made a motion to apply for the funds as specified; Mr. Giltner seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.
