

WHEREAS, by prior resolution of this Board, certain monies due to the Kern County Superintendent of Schools Office from the County as local tax revenues have been impounded against contingent tax liabilities in litigation or tax appeal cases; and

WHEREAS, by recent letters the County Counsel has notified the Kern County Superintendent of Schools Office of an excess of local tax revenues in the impound fund due to recent settlements.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board resolves as follows:

- A. All of the above recitals are found to be true and correct.
- B. The Board hereby orders the Superintendent to:
 - Determine the exact amount of impound monies which should be released to the County School Service Fund (86010) to meet and articulate with all pending fiscal needs of the District.
 - 2. Notify, on behalf of this Board, the County Auditor's Office in writing of the amount to be so released and the effective date for such release.
- C. The Kern County Superintendent of Schools has determined this amount to be \$1,330.10.
- D. A copy of this resolution shall be delivered to the County Auditor-Controller and Kern County Superintendent of Schools office forthwith.
